

Maple Cemetery, East Arrow Park, BC

Arrow Park was a small community on the Arrow Lakes, located 15-20 miles from Nakusp, across the lake. It was opened up for development around the turn of the century and became fairly well settled, with many small farms. When plans were announced to flood the valley, all the residents were forced to sell their places to B.C. Hydro and resettle on higher land. Their homes were destroyed in preparation for the flood waters, which, ironically, never rose to the level of many of the farms. B.C. Hydro now has the land up for sale again (1982), and one can still see remnants of many lovely old places. The book, <u>Whistle Stops Along the Columbia River Narrows</u>, include Arrow Park and East Arrow Park among other small West Kootenay communities.
