## ENDAKO CEMETERY, FRASER LAKE, BC

Location: on the Endako Mine Road, Lot No. DL 2168, 1.89 acres.

The parish register was held by Rev. Allen McLeod of Vanderhoof, BC. There were only 12 names in the register for people buried in Endako Cemetery. Most of the burial records were destroyed in a 1932 house fire at Rev. Sweetman's at Endako. This Endako Cemetery was once the only cemetery in the country side besides one on the Stella Indian Reservation. The Endako Cemetery served the communities of Fraser Lake, Endako, Savory, East Francois Lake, Glannan and Nithi Valley. Oldtimers in area said the cemetery started in 1910-1912, prior to the construction of the railroad. One cemetery was located north of the Anglican Church (built 1922) and the other one was  $\frac{3}{4}$  miles west of the church.

All of the graves except 2 were moved to the present cemetery on the Endako Mine Road, this was because of the one cemetery west of the church was on government land and the one north of the church had a large spring and there was too much water seepage. The cemetery north of the church has 2 graves, one was for a baby OLDS girl of 1916 and the other one is a man (name unknown).

The Endako Cemetery being restored was begun around 1917. It was donated by Edward and Sophie DIXON (now deceased) and subdivided off their farm on May 4, 1927 by Vilhelm Schjelderup, a Burns Lake surveyor. It was officially opened on May 29, 1928 by Lieutenant Governor in Council.

Mr. Ivan RAY of Fraser Lake, now 87 years old, stated that he arrived here in March of 1920, got off the train in Fort Fraser, with his horse and took the road Endako, the only town here. Then he took the Endako Mountain Trail (now Endako Mine Road) to his homestead in the Nithi Valley. He stated that the cemetery on the Endako Mine Road was already there in March 1920.

This cemetery has been more or less abandoned for the last 50 years and only eight graves remain marked.

Approximately 3200 trees, mostly tall and skinny, were removed during the spring and summer of 1987 and with the help of the Fraser Lake and District Historical Society, work bees were held and most of this brush burnt.

Archeologists planned to be there in the spring to pinpoint the exact location of all the graves. Then the cemetery will be landscaped and a white picket fence will put in surrounding it along with new head boards on the graves. Also, a donor's plaque, sponsorship plaque and a historical write-up plaque on at\the cemetery will be placed.
