

Mt. Young Cemetery (Royal Marines), San Juan Island, Washington State

The cemetery is on Mt.Young, about 3/4 mile uphill from the English Camp (close to Roche Harbour, NW corner of the island), within a National Historic Park administered by the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior. Plaque: "English Cemetery / In Memory of seven members of the / Royal Marine Light Infantry / and / one civilian who died, here, / during / Boundary Negotations / 1860-1872 / Erected by the / University Naval Training Division / Royal Canadian Navy / for the / Maritime Museum of B.C. August 1964. /"

[The five standing stones, commemorating seven Marines, are enclosed within a white picket fence about 15×20 yards, on which are mounted seven plaques reproducing the memorial inscriptions on the stones, and indicating the positions of the burials of Thomas Riddy and Charles Wood. The civilian does not have a headstone, and is not identified.]
