Cawston is a small community in the south Similkameen Valley (Okanagan-Boundary) which was first settled in 1800. It was named after a pioneer rancher and magistrate, R. L. Cawston. It is near an old Hudson's Bay Company store. The current population is approximately 900. Cawston is located on Highway #3 (Crownsnest Highway), approximately 8 km southeast of Keremeos and west of the blinking light.

The cemetery is located off Highway 3, turn east at the blinking light on to Coulthard Ave and go 2 blocks crossing Ferko Road and just up the hill on your right is the cemetery set back a ways from the road.

There is parking off the road in front of the cemetery. A road does go through the cemetery but it is not a big cemetery and easy to walk. As is usual in this semi-arid area there is no grass and instead coloured rocks have been used on the graves. Wear enclosed shoes as there are small cacti in this cemetery.

When asking the cemetery caretaker or writing to the Cawston Community Hall Society about a grave site use the lot designation (see plot map below). The larger plots have 8 spaces and the smaller 4. The usual, but not always, order is
